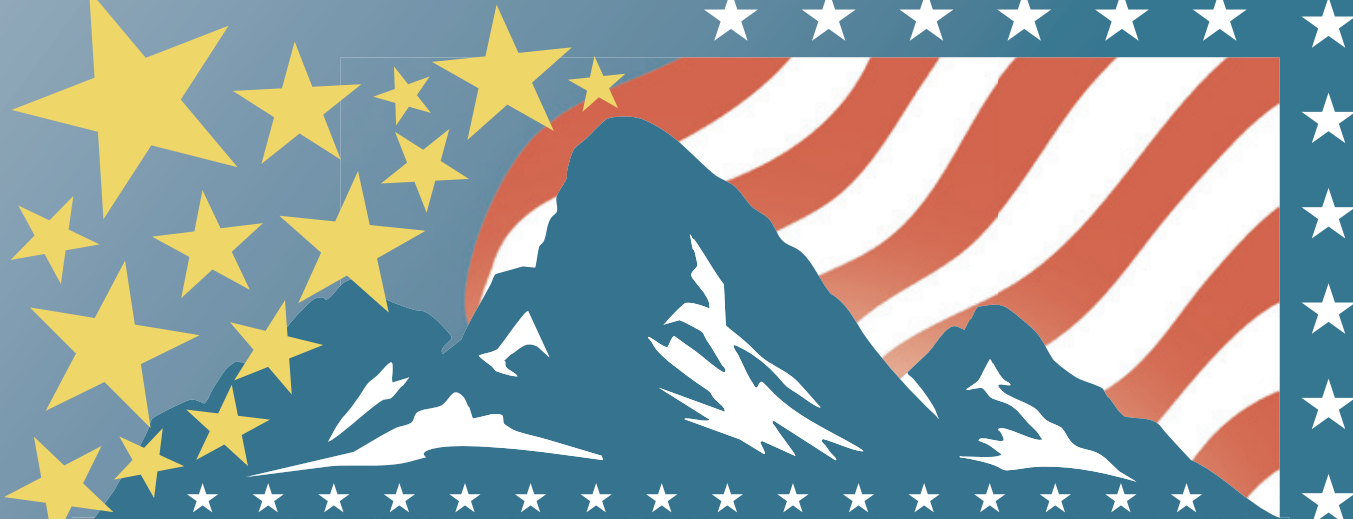

Over the last year, we have made significant progress on our Master Plan.

MILESTONES

A generous grant from the Teton Ridge Foundation brought several necessary upgrades. New panels for the entire Outdoor Arena and livestock area has raised the bar on accessibility and safety. Connecting water and sewer service to the City of Driggs was essential for all future infrastructure.

Just in time for the first ever PRCA Rodeo in Teton Valley, a brand new restroom building and concession stand was completed! Also, Teton County Public Works and the Idaho Department of Transportation installed a turning lane onto Fairgrounds Drive so even approaching and leaving the Fairgrounds will be safer!

Our fair building received a much-needed makeover with barn wood wainscote and panelling, generously donated in memory of

Chris Runyan. Special thanks to the Runyan Family and to Los Virginios Painting who did a great job on the installation.

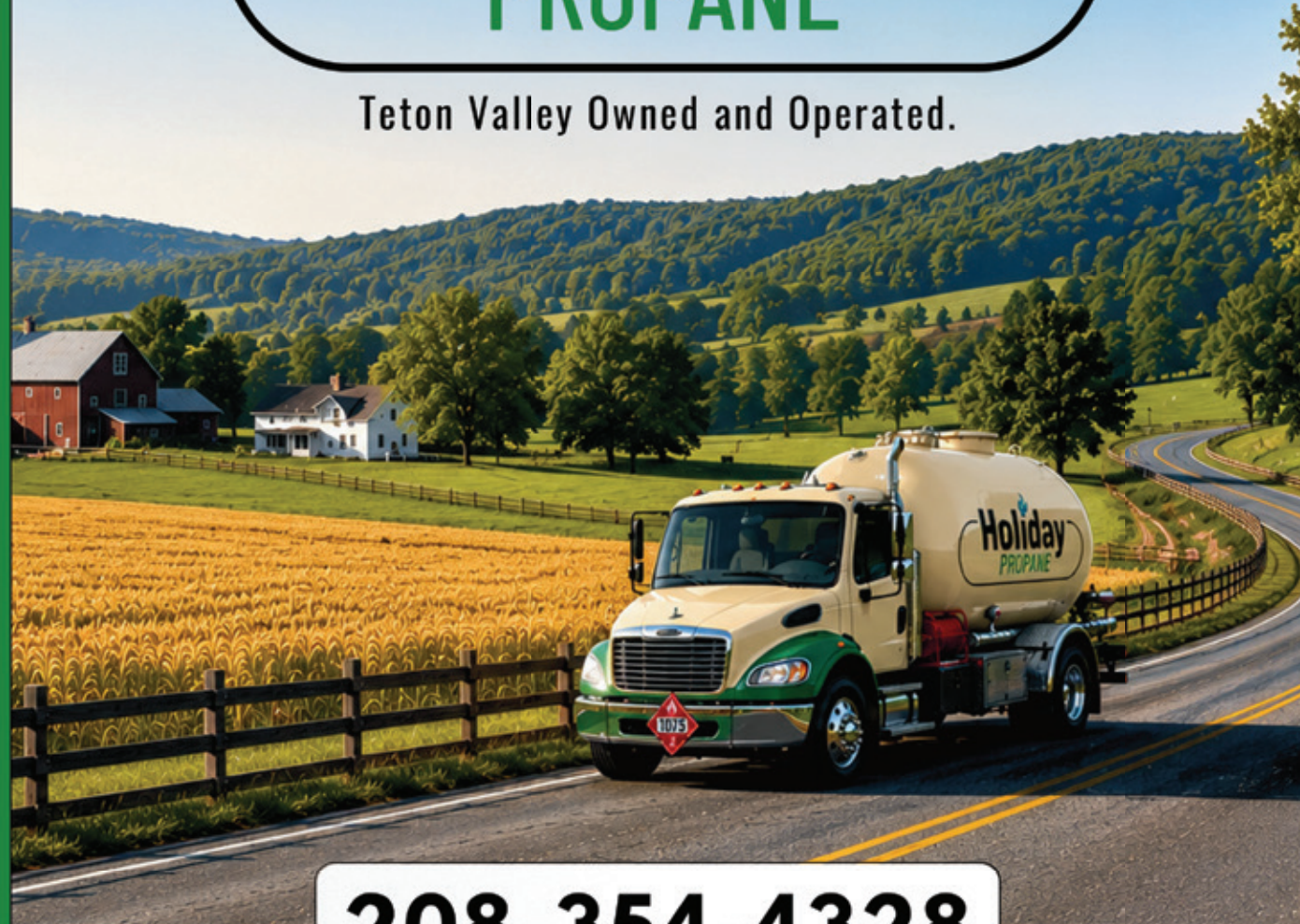

4-H/FFA Swine, Sheep, Goat & Beef Show

Thursday, July 30
8am, Pavilion

The 4-H livestock show features market and showmanship classes for swine, sheep, goat and beef. In the market classes, kids show off their animals to their best advantage and judges award ribbons based on condition and confirmation. Animals which have the best proportions, fat to muscle ratios and structure rank the highest. In the showmanship classes, kids demonstrate their ability to groom their animal, their skill at setting their animal up to highlight its best features and their overall knowledge of their livestock projects. Livestock that is judged in the market class is eligible to be sold at the livestock auction on Friday, July 31, 5pm.

4-H/FFA Poultry Show

Thursday, July 30
3pm, Pavilion

The 4-H poultry show features animals raised by local 4-H kids to compete in breed or market classes. The show is divided into two parts. First the animals are judged on their breed or market qualifications. Second the kids are judged in a showmanship class on the grooming of their animal, knowledge of their breed and their ability to show their animal to its best advantage. Poultry that is judged in the market class is eligible to be sold at the livestock auction on Friday, July 31, 5pm.

4-H/FFA Livestock Auction

Friday, July 31, 5pm, Pavilion
The Teton County 4H/FFA Livestock Auction is your chance to purchase premium, locally raised meat while supporting hard working youth in Teton County. The auction features live animals raised locally and shown at Teton County fair. Each animal is sold to the highest bidder based on the final bid at the auction. Buyers will pay for the animal at the time of the sale and select a processor. A list of processors that have agreed to take livestock sale animals will be available. You may use a processor of your choice, but you must make all arrangements in advance. 4-H/FFA Youth will deliver animals to the processor. Buyers will pick up their meat from the processor, typically, within 3-4 weeks. If you have any questions about processing meat for public donations, please contact us. Many families and local businesses participate in the livestock sale each year to fill freezers with healthy, locally produced meat and support the next generation of agricultural leaders. Livestock projects teach valuable life skills such as teamwork, sportsmanship, responsibility, recordkeeping, and public speaking. Youth track expenses, keep detailed project records, work together in club meetings and present their projects during interviews and group evaluations. Project animals are well cared for, raised on high-quality feed and given daily attention from the youth who show them. Many 4-H/FFA youth raise animals year after year, building their skills and using their earnings for college or career training. If you're ready to invest in a young person's future-and enjoy some of the best locally raised meats available-

Family Fun for All Ages

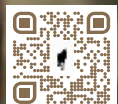

• **10am:** For our first presentation of the year, we will tour the FFA Animal Barn. FFA students will introduce us to their project animals and explain why they chose to participate in FFA. They will also discuss the factors judges consider when evaluating and placing animals in competition, including the qualifications and characteristics that contribute to successful showmanship and livestock placement.

This will be an excellent opportunity to learn about animal agriculture, leadership development, and the hard work and dedication involved in FFA projects.

Kearsley Farms

Our second presentation will take place at Kearsley Farms, where we will tour their tree farm and learn about the practices they use to successfully grow and maintain healthy trees. We will discuss how conservation principles are incorporated into their operation, including soil and water stewardship, sustainable growing practices, and long-term land management. Participants will also learn about the types of trees grown at the farm, the process from planting to harvest, and the customers and organizations Kearsley Farms supplies with trees. This presentation will provide a valuable look at how conservation and agriculture work together to support a successful and sustainable tree-growing operation.



Piquet Ranch Stream Restoration Project with FTR

Final Stop Piquet Ranch Stream Restoration Project with FTR: the final stop on this year's Farm Tour will highlight a collaborative project to restore streambanks and integrate managed grazing along the Teton River. This project stabilized 1,770 linear feet of eroding and heavily impacted stream banks using

bioengineering techniques, reducing sediment loads in the Teton River by an estimated 36 tons/year. In addition, livestock grazing and watering best management practices will be implemented to continue improving soil health and forage production on this parcel. This project is part of a larger "Rivers & Ranches" effort led by Friends of the Teton River and the Henry's Fork Foundation in partnership with Teton Valley farmers and ranchers to improve water quality, soil health, and riparian habitat.

Horse Pulling goes back to the time when farming and ranching chores were accomplished with teams of horses led by a driver called a teamster. The teamsters often challenged each other over who had the toughest and best team. These challenges migrated from farms and fields to the arena to determine the strongest team.

There are three weight classes determined by the team's combined weight. Each team hooks on to a stone boat that is loaded with concrete weights. They pull between two ropes that are 14 feet apart and get two tries to pull the boat 27.5 feet. Those that pull the distance will come back to pull again with weights of 500 to 1,000 pounds added each time. The team that pulls the most weight the farthest wins the weight class. It is a true test of athleticism, conditioning and skilled driving by the teamster.

I have loved every minute of being a 4-H member and am incredibly grateful for all the opportunities I have had through this program.

I am so proud to be a 4-H member. I attribute my success, academically and otherwise, to the lessons and opportunities I have gained through the various clubs and from the amazing leaders.

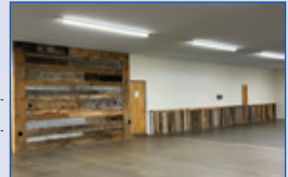
